



ART MADRID'26: MORE THAN TWO DECADES SUPPORTING CONTEMPORARY CREATION

Art Madrid, the contemporary art fair that paved the way for other events to coexist alongside it on the calendar, returns to the Galería de Cristal of the Palacio de Cibeles from March 4 to 8, 2026.

Its 21st edition brings together a selection of 35 national and international galleries, consolidating its status as a key reference in Spain's cultural scene.

With over two decades of history, Art Madrid continues to enrich its Parallel Program, demonstrating its ongoing commitment to artists, collectors, and making contemporary art accessible to the public.

Madrid, December 9, 2025 — Art Madrid'26 will once again be held at the Galería de Cristal of the Palacio de Cibeles, in the heart of the capital, from March 4 to 8. In its 21st edition, the fair will present a **Galleries Program composed of young, mid-career, and well-established spaces** — both national and international. It offers a representative vision of the most recent artistic production, resulting from the research and new aesthetic codes cultivated by the represented artists.

During the fair, attendees will be able to explore how the works on display redefine the cultural landscape and assert themselves strongly in the current art market, **confirming Art Madrid's role as a reference in the national art scene**.

In this edition, its character as a cultural event — an ephemeral space that brings together the pulse of contemporary art each year — unfolds as a reflection on space in all its forms, **inviting the public to discover a new way of seeing and experiencing a place that changes, that is transmuted by and for contemporary art**.

PARALLEL PROGRAM: Fragments, Relations and Imaginary Distances

The Parallel Program of Art Madrid'26 is conceived as a space for reflection that expands the understanding of the fair **beyond its commercial dimension**, proposing it as an ephemeral organism - a relational space where artwork, public, architecture and experience coexist.

For this purpose, Art Madrid will feature the following initiatives:

- **CURATED INTERVIEW PROGRAM:** The curator and art critic **Adonay Bermúdez** will delve into the creative processes of artists such as **Carmen Baena** (Galería BAT), **Sergio Rocafort** (Shiras Galería), **Chamo San** (Inéditad Gallery), **Cedric Le Corf** (Loo & Lou Gallery), **Daniel Bum** (CLC ARTE), **Iyán Castaño** (Galería Arancha Osoro), **Julian Manzelli (Chu)** (g • gallery), **DIMASLA (Diana + Álvaro)** (Galería La Mercería).
- **OPEN BOOTH:** This is the fair's space dedicated to supporting an artist at the beginning of their career. In this edition, Daniel Barrio (Cuba, 1988) has been selected to realize a *site-specific* work.
- **ESPACIO NEBRIJA:** A curatorial project developed by Fine Arts students from Universidad Nebrija, presented during the fair. This project is sponsored by Liquitex.
- **PERFORMANCE CYCLE:** An initiative aimed at strengthening the presence of female artists through performative works that explore the relationships between body, memory, and representation within the ephemeral context of an art fair. It addresses tensions between the visible and the hidden, the individual and the collective, while including posthuman, decolonial, and ecological perspectives. The cycle reveals the symbolic bonds traversing bodies, objects, and spaces, transforming the audience's experience and expanding the perception of contemporary art. This project is sponsored by One Shot Hotels.
- **LECTURAS. CURATED WALKTHROUGHS:** An initiative designed to bring the public closer to the artworks showcased in the Galleries Program. For this edition, art historians and cultural communicators **Marisol Salanova and Zuriñe Lafón** will lead the thematic walkthrough. This cultural mediation project is supported by One Shot Hotels.
- **ONE SHOT COLLECTORS PROGRAM:** Under the guidance of art advisor and appraiser Ana Suárez Gisbert, Art Madrid offers a free advisory service for acquiring artworks. With this initiative, the fair maintains its commitment to encouraging collecting and making contemporary art accessible to a broader public.
- **PATRONAGE PROGRAM:** Since last year's edition, Art Madrid has reinforced its commitment to artistic creation through awards and acquisitions. The program increases the visibility of participating artists and promotes collecting and patronage.
